Calling youth across Canada to help the ocean!

This spring, Ocean Networks Canada (ONC), an initiative of the University of Victoria, has launched a new national project, the #OceanDecade Challenge, which was developed in partnership with Girl Guides of Canada and Fisheries and Oceans Canada.

The #OceanDecade Challenge is designed to encourage young people in Canada from coast-to-coast-to-coast to participate in the UN Ocean Decade through a set of fun and engaging ocean science learning activities based on the 7 Ocean Decade Outcomes. The games, hands-on activities and experiments are designed for kids from seven to twelve years of age, but youth of any age are welcome to participate. Teachers, youth leaders and informal educators are encouraged to

Third Call for Decade Actions now live!




This Call for Decade Actions is focused on Challenge 3 – Sustainable Blue Food and Challenge 4 – Sustainable Ocean Economy. **Submit your activities, projects, or programmes** that will enhance the sustainability of ocean science before the call closes on August 30, 2022.
